# Publish/Share Power BI dashboards and reports to others

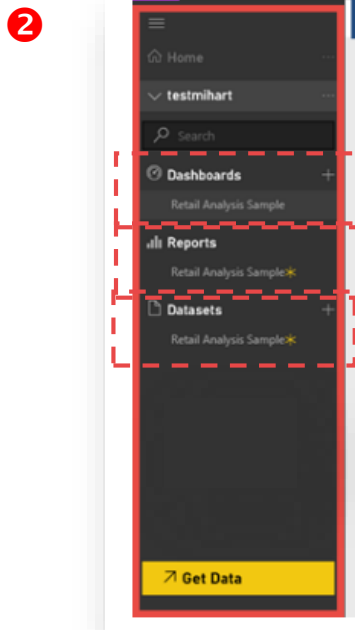
## Share Dashboards

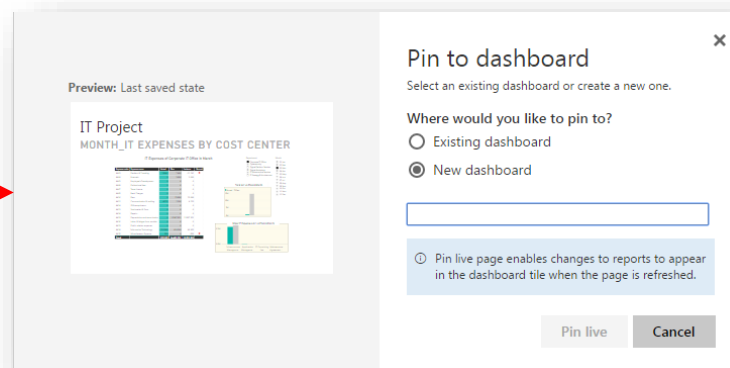

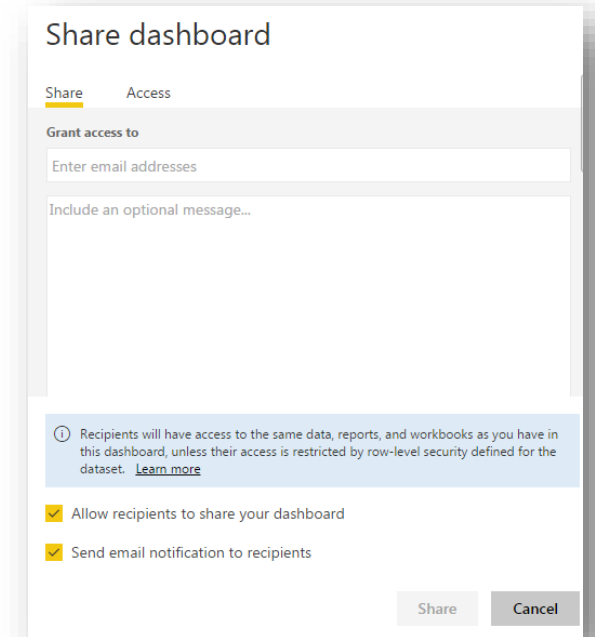

# How to collaborate in Power BI

<b>More than one persons prepare report</b>	To share data & dashboard to team	Save as .PBIX file and send via email to team	Free	- Team have to install Power BI Desktop or Power BI service to open file - Data and dashboard are not link to others

# How to register for Power BI Pro (Free trial)


1) Open Power BI Service: <https://powerbi.microsoft.com/en-us/landing/signin/>

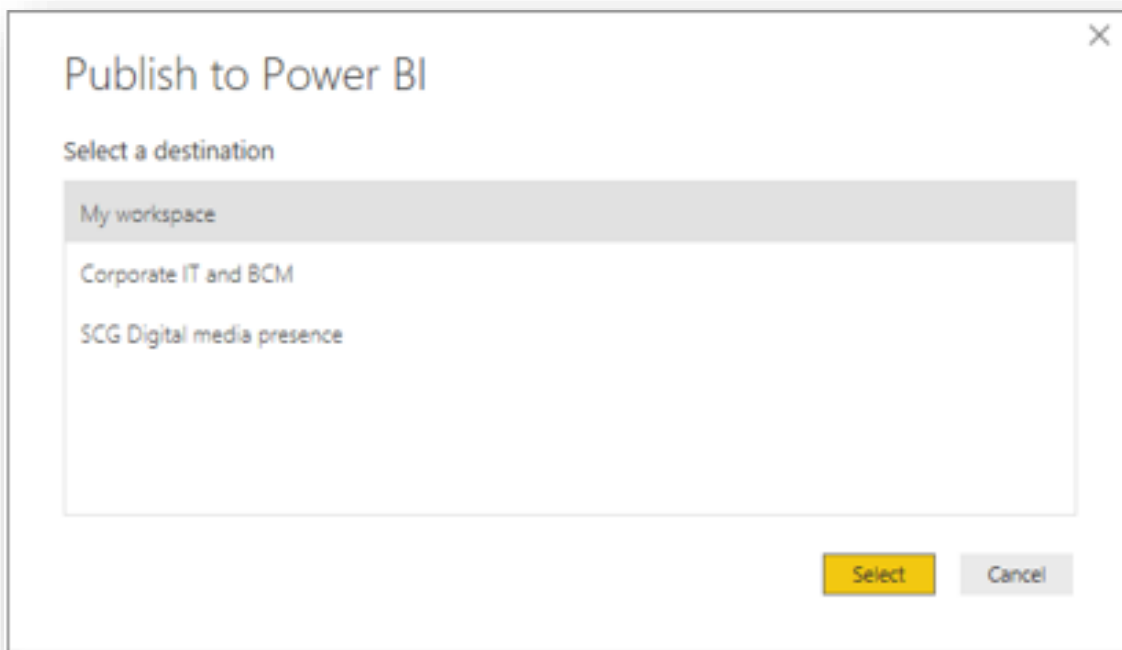

# How to create **group workspace**

Groups in Power BI are “**workspaces**” where you and your colleagues can collaborate on your Power BI dashboards and reports.

**\*\* Everyone in your Power BI group workspace needs a **Power BI Pro license.** \*\***



Group workspaces in Power BI are built on Office 365 groups. You can give everyone in the group the same permissions, or you can give some members just read-only permissions.

Another way is publishing **an organizational content pack** adds it to the Content Pack Library. This centralized repository makes it easy for members to browse and discover dashboards, reports, and datasets published for them.

Organizational content packs are only available when you and your colleagues have Power BI Pro.
